SECTION A

Read these rules and conditions carefully as they govern all bets accepted by the Company.

DEFINITIONS:

1. In these Rules, the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them, respectively, unless there is something in the subject or context inconsistent with such construction or unless it is therein otherwise expressly provided:-
 - a) **“The Company”** means **BIG 'A' TRACK 2003 LIMITED**, trading as **SUPREME VENTURES SPORTS BETTING**.
 - b) **“Head Office”** means the Registered Office of the Company which is located at 4th Floor, 28 – 48 Barbados Avenue, Kingston 5 or such other place as may for the time being be the registered office of the Company.
 - c) **“Operating Office”** means the place where administrative functions of the Company are conducted. The Operating Office is located at 8th floor, CitiGroup Building, 63 Knutsford Boulevard, Kingston 5.
 - d) **“Bet”** means an offer for a fixed odds (including horseracing) or sports bet wager which had been accepted by the Company in accordance with the provision of these Rules. The minimum bet for horseracing is \$40 and for sports betting \$50. The maximum bet automatically accepted by the Central Computer System is \$50,000.
 - e) **“Bet Outcomes”** means a prediction for win (denoted by ‘1’); draw (denoted by ‘X’) and loss (denoted by ‘2’) in the options provided.

- f) “**Player**” means an individual who must be 18 years and over and who offers to make a bet for a fixed odds (including horseracing) event or sports bet.
- g) “**Betting Office**” means any location contracted by the Company at which bets for fixed odds (including horseracing) events or sports bets are offered for sale on its behalf.
- h) “**Sales Agent**” means any person contracted by the Company to sell fixed odds (including horseracing) bets or sports bets on its behalf.
- i) “**Bet Writer**” means any person authorized in writing by the Company to receive or negotiate bets in the Betting Office establishment at which the offer to make the bet is made. The Company’s Role Profile denotes this position as Customer Service Representative.
- j) “**Central Computer System**” means the company’s computerized system supplied by its technology provider INTRALOT Jamaica for accepting an offer to bet, as approved by the Betting, Gaming and Lotteries Commission and as evidenced by the generation of a bar encoded ticket from an online computer terminal at the Betting Office.
- k) “**The Company’s Program**” means a publication by the Company and bearing the Company’s Logo which sets out the fixed odds (including horseracing) event or sports events on which offers may be made to the Company of bets and the type of bet which may be contained in such offer.
- l) “**Bet Slip or Notepad**” means the original voucher in paper or electronic form written up containing particulars of the offer which the person offering to make the bet makes to the Company.
- m) “**Winnings**” means the difference between the amount to be paid-out and the amount staked on any particular winning bet.
- n) “**Claim Period**” means the time after the result of an event that was bet on and during which holders of winning tickets may claim their winnings. The claim period is established as 90 days for sports or other bet types outside of horseracing.

- o) “**Ticket**” means a printed receipt from the online computer terminal containing a Player’s specified bet.
- p) “**Validation**” means the process and procedures by which winning tickets presented at the Sales Agent by a Player are checked and verified through the online computer system.
- q) “**Results**” mean the official results for a fixed odds (including horseracing) or sports betting event released by the governing body or Association for the event. The Company will only pay winnings for wagers based on these Results.
- r) “**Advantage**” means any handicap that may be assigned to a team or participant in a fixed odds (including horseracing) or sports event. It is a spread where teams are awarded a number of points to start, depending on their likelihood of winning.
- s) “**High Stake Bet**” means any bet above \$50,000. The Central Computer System will not automatically accept this bet. The Bet Writer will be required to call the Company’s Hotline for approval to accept the High Stake Bet. A special code will be issued to the Bet Writer for input in the terminal, in order for the High Stake Bet to be accepted by the Central Computer System. Risk Management reserves the right to reduce the ‘High Stake Bet’ amount ceiling for an event, if the trend in liabilities indicates a potential risk for the company.
- t) “**Regional Centre**” means the Branch Offices operated by Big ‘A’ Track 2003 Limited that are authorized to negotiate bets for fixed odds (including horseracing) events or sports bets on its behalf and to validate winning tickets on the online computer system up to \$500,000. The Regional Centres are located as follows:
- 28 Half Way Tree Road, Kingston 5
 - 8 Gordon Town Road, Kingston 6
 - 37 Young Street, Spanish Town, St. Catherine
 - Bargain Village Plaza, 35 Main Street, May Pen, Clarendon
 - Lyon’s Plaza, 74 Great George Street, Savanna-la-Mar, Westmoreland

- u) **“Prize Payment Centre”** means the Branch Office operated by Big ‘A’ Track 2003 Limited, located at 1st floor, Sagicor Centre, 28 – 48 Barbados Avenue, Kingston 5 that is authorized to negotiate bets for fixed odds (including horseracing) events or sports bets on its behalf and to validate winning tickets on the online computer with no maximum limit.
- v) **“Golden Goal”** means the first goal scored during extra time of a game, that declares the winner of the game.
- w) **“Own Goal”** means when a player scores a goal that is registered against his or her own team.
- x) **“Under” and “Over”** means a bet on whether the total number of goals scored by both teams during play will be under or over the specified Goal Limit.
- y) **“Head to Head”** mean a straight two-way competition bet, usually without a draw being offered.
- z) **“Scorecasts”** mean a combination bet in a sporting event where the wager combines the correct score of the match with a bet on who will score the goal(s) or points in the game.
- aa) **“WRC”** means World Rally Championship.
- bb) **“Cross Entry”** represents the automatic cancellation of a sale in the Central System when it recognizes an error in the processing of a transaction. This entry will appear in the ticket report from the Central System and will entail a coupon number being displayed twice on the report. The first display denotes the transaction type as a sale and the other display denotes the cross entry for automatic cancellation.

SECTION B

GENERAL RULES: (HORSE RACING BETTING)

2. It is a basic condition of the writing up and the acceptance of every voucher or generation of a bar encoded ticket and the basis of any agreement, arrangement or transaction concerning or affecting the acceptance of any bet by the Company and of anything done in connection therewith and all arrangements relating thereto (whether mentioned in these Rules or to be implied) that the same is governed by these Rules. Every person by or on whose behalf a voucher is written up or bar encoded ticket is generated from the online computer system shall be deemed to have read these Rules and to have accepted as a condition of his offer to bet being accepted by the Company the terms and conditions set out therein. The Rules are available at all Supreme Ventures Sports Betting locations.

3. (1) When
- (a) one of the Company's betting vouchers has been written by or on behalf of a person and has been accepted by the Company's computerized system, and
 - (b) the amount of the money staked has been paid to the Bet Writer or authorized Company employee, in accordance with Rule 10.

The same shall constitute an offer by the person by whom or on whose behalf the voucher was written to make a bet with the Company on the event as written on the voucher or as evidenced on the bar encoded computerized ticket.

- (2) The Company will not take manual bets. The offer will be accepted by the Company through an authorized employee where there is a terminal connected to the online computer system that generates a bar encoded ticket for the specified bet.

4. The Company will require that:

(1) (i) Local Racing

For Local Racing, where a bet or series of bets totaling \$2000 or more in the case of single horses or \$500 or more in the case of Accumulators', Quinelas, Exactas, Double Events, Tricasts, Trifectas, etc. is negotiated by an authorized employee, the Bet Writer is required to inform the head office of the Company before the first of the relevant race so involved.

(ii) English Racing

For English Racing, where a bet or series of bets totaling \$1000 or more in the case of single horses or \$250 or more in the case of Accumulators', Quinelas, Exactas, Double Events, Tricasts, Trifectas, etc. is negotiated by an authorized employee, the Bet Writer is required to inform the head office of the Company before the first of the relevant race so involved.

(2) In paragraph (1) of this Rule the expression "relevant time" shall be the latest time fixed by the Company's programme for the acceptance of offers in respect of the earliest of the races or events printed on the bar encoded ticket. This is half hour before the start of a Horse Racing event and 5 minutes before the start of a sports betting event.

(3) It is a condition of the acceptance of any bet which has been accepted by the Company's computerized system that in the event of any dispute arising out of any bet or offer to make a bet and in any legal or arbitration proceedings or investigations, a report printed by the company's computer system shall be conclusive and overriding evidence of the voucher bearing the same numerical sequence and of the contents thereof and of any fact stated therein, including, without derogating from the generality of the foregoing, conclusive evidence of each bet contained in the said voucher

and as to the time of acceptance hereof. The Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission is the final arbiter for such disputes.

5. Offers will not be accepted from any person under the age of eighteen years. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 3 hereof, any offer to make a bet made by any person who is referred to in this Rule shall be void and incapable of acceptance.
6. Any offer to make a bet may be made only for those races or sports bets specified in the Company's programme for the day on which each such race or sport activity scheduled to occur. Such an offer as aforesaid may be made only for a bet of the nature specified in the Company's programme in respect of each such item. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 3 hereof, any offer to make a bet which does not comply with Rules shall be void and incapable of acceptable.
7. The Company will not be responsible for any inaccuracy or omission on the Company's programme. The Company reserves the right to rectify clerical errors for example through a terminal message on the online computer system.
8. The voucher/bar encoded ticket shall constitute the terms of the offer to make the bet therein stated. It is the **sole** responsibility of the person by or on whose behalf the offer to make the bet with the Company is made, to ascertain that his requirements have been accurately recorded to his satisfaction by carefully checking the voucher/bar encoded ticket before leaving the Betting Office.
9. The Company has the sole right to deem null and void any portion of the voucher/bar encoded ticket that may be illegible, damaged or mutilated in any form or which contains any ambiguity or if the Company is not satisfied with the bona fide of the voucher/bar encoded ticket presented.

10. No offer to bet shall be complete and capable of acceptance until the Bet Writer or authorized employee has been paid the amount of money staked according to the terms contained on the voucher and in the Rules. The authorized employee will generate a ticket from the terminal connected to the online computer system for the amount staked.

11. Maximum Winnings
 - (i) The maximum payable at a Betting Office on Exacta, Quinela, Double Events, Tricast and Trifecta for bets accepted on English, American and Local Horse Racing is the official dividend declared, to a maximum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00). Payouts above \$200,000 will be made at a Regional Retail Centre.

 - (ii) There are no maximum odds on all bets on overseas racing.

 - (iii) The maximum winnings payable for sports bets is \$5 million. The Company reserves the right to make payments by cheque. However, payouts above \$200,000 will be made at a Regional Retail Centre.

 - (iv) The foregoing applies to all bets legitimately brought via the Company's central computer system.

12. In an Accumulator bet, the client loses if one of the Horses named by him in the voucher/bar encoded ticket fails to Win or Place, as the case may be.

13. The minimum stake for an Accumulator Bet is \$40.

14. Any claim for payment of winnings or for a refund of stakes on horseracing must be made to the Company within sixty (60) days after the day on which the horse race or horse races were run or were scheduled to run, as the case may be. Any

claim for payment of winnings or for a refund of sports bets or bets on other events must be made to the Company within **ninety (90) days** after the day on which the sports activity was scheduled to take place.

In order to entitle a client to any such payment or refund the client must present and surrender to the Company the voucher/bar encoded ticket in respect thereof. After the expiration of any such period of sixty (60) days for horseracing and **ninety (90) days** for sports events, the Company will be under no liability to make any payment or refund in respect thereof.

15. Where in any offer there is no express statement as to whether the offer relates to a Win bet or a Place bet, the offer will be interpreted as an Offer of a Win bet.
16. (i) Where in any offer the amount specified as the total stake is different than the amount specified as the unit stake taken with the number of bets written in the offer, the offer will be interpreted as an offer to bet on the selections specified and in the manner specified but the number of bets will be changed in proportion to the amount that should have been the total staked.

(ii) The minimum unit stake for horse racing is forty (\$40) dollars. The minimum stake per voucher/bar encoded ticket for sports betting is fifty (\$50) dollars.

(iii) This amount may be superseded after approval of the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission and a notice displayed at the Betting Office.

17. (a) Forecasts/Quinelas (Horse Racing)
Where the pool conducted at the Track on which the race is run declares a Quinela Dividend as the case may be or where a Quinela Dividend is declared on a combination other than the two Horses which have been placed in the first two places, in such a race, the Company shall pay its maximum dividend on the actual winning combination. All other combinations will be considered losing bets.
- (b) Where the pool conducted at the track on which the race is run declares no Trifecta Dividend or where a Trifecta Dividend is declared on a combination other than the three Horses which have been placed in the first three places, in such a race, the Company shall pay its maximum dividend on the actual winning combination. All other combinations will be considered losing bets.
18. Where a bet specifies a Quinela bet on two Horses, which are not engaged in the same race on the race day for which the bet is made, the bet will be interpreted as a Win Accumulator on the two Horses named.
19. In the event of a horse race meeting being postponed, all bets for that meeting will be void. In the event of some of the races scheduled to be run at a horse race meeting being postponed, all bets on the cancelled or void races at the meeting will be treated as non-runners (See Rule 37).
20. Save as is provided in Rules 17 and 22 all bets will be paid to those who have made valid bets on the horse or combination of horses on which the Totalisator at the race course on which the race is run pays a dividend. Save as aforesaid, if the said Totalisator does not pay a dividend on any Horse or combination of Horses the bet with the Company is a losing bet.

21. Where a bet specifies a “Place” Bet, whether single or accumulated on a Horse but no place pool is conducted on the race at the horse race course on which the race is run, the bet will be refunded.
22. Unlimited offers to make “Place” bets only will be accepted on all single horses, accumulators, RTC’s OCB’s (RTC’s without singles) and Perm Bets. No win stake is required.
23. Save and except as provided in Rule 25 where a named selection is declared to start in two or more races on the same day and no race or an incorrect race is specified on the voucher the bet will be interpreted as a bet on the first race in which the Horse runs on the said day.
24. Where a named selection is specified on a voucher then the bet will be interpreted as a bet on the named selection notwithstanding that the horse race specified on the voucher may be incorrectly numbered or identified.
25. In an Accumulator Bet to Win, if two or more of the Horses named on the voucher run in the same race, the portion of the bet naming the two or more Horses is void except where one or more of the Horses named is declared to start in another race scheduled to run on the same day. In this case, the bet shall be interpreted as a bet on such horse in the other race.
26. Where more than one Horse is specified in a bet, the bet will be interpreted as an Accumulator on all the Horses named in the bet, unless the contrary is expressly stated on the voucher/bar encoded ticket.
27. Commissions at Ante-Post prices on Horse races run outside Jamaica will be executed at the best available odds at the time of receipt of the Commission on the

- basis of all in, run or not, entered or not. Commission at Ante-Post prices on Horse races run in Jamaica will not be accepted by the Company. Every offer of a bet on horse races run in Jamaica must be made at Totalisator odds.
28. Ante-Post bets on Horse races run outside of Jamaica will stand provided that the Race is run on the day originally scheduled or on some other day.
 29. Where a Dead-heat is declared between two runners, either of whom is the subject of an Ante-Post bet or bet at Starting Price, in either case accepted by the Company, half the stake is lost and the full odds paid on the other half. Where more than two runners finish in a Dead-Heat this rule will apply in mathematical proportion to the number of Horses in the Dead-Heat.
 30. The Company does not undertake to advise any client of any error in its instructions or any point which such instructions do not agree with any of these Rules.
 31. Any amendment to these Rules shall be published in a daily newspaper printed and circulated in Jamaica and will come into force as per Conditions of the licence established by the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission.
 32. Double Events
Where in any offer to bet on horse races run in Jamaica in which two horses are named and there is no expressed statement as to whether the offer relates to a Double Event Bet or an Accumulator Bet, the offer will be interpreted as an offer of an Accumulator bet.
 33. Where a bet on horse races run in Jamaica specifies a Double Event Bet but one or both of the races specified on the voucher/bar encoded ticket is not a race on which the promoter of the races in question is conducting Double Event betting, the offer will be interpreted as a Win Accumulator on the Horses named.

34. Where

- (a) an offer to bet on a horse race run in Jamaica specifies a Quinela or Trifecta Bet, but the race specified on the voucher/bar encoded ticket is not a race on which the promoter of the race in question is conducting Quinela or Trifecta betting, as the case may be, the offer of the bet is incapable of acceptance by the Company and the amount staked will be refunded.
- (b) an offer to bet on a race run in Jamaica specifies an Exacta bet, but the race specified on the voucher/bar encoded ticket is not a race on which the promoter of the race in question is conducting Exacta betting, the offer of the bet is incapable of acceptance by the Company and the amount staked will be refunded provided however, that where the promoter of the race in question is conducting Quinela betting, the offer will be interpreted as an offer of a Quinela Bet.

35. Double Events

Where the pool conducted at the race track in Jamaica on which the races are run Declares no Double Event Dividend or where a Double Event Dividend is declared on a combination other than the two Horses which have won their respective races, all Double Event Bets placed with the Company on the said races will be interpreted as Win accumulators on the two Horses named on the voucher/bar encoded ticket.

36. Where in regard to Jamaican horse racing, a Totalisator is used by the promoter of the race meeting at the race course on which the race meeting is being promoted, the following Rules shall apply notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other of these Rules:-

- (a) The "Field" shall bear the meaning contained in the Totalisator's Rules for the time being in force as approved pursuant to the Third Schedule of The Betting , Gaming and Lotteries Act:

- (b) “Starter’s Orders” shall bear the meaning contained in the Jamaica Racing Commission Racing Rules, 1977 or in any Racing Rules amending or replacing the same;
- (c) If a Horse named in a bet is grouped in the “Field” such bet shall be a bet on all the Horses grouped in the “Field”;
- (d) If a Horse named in a bet is grouped in the “Field” and does not come under Starter’s Orders, the bet will be “on” provided the field has at least one actual starter.
- (e) Grouping the “Field” does not apply to Ante-Posts bets. The actual horse named in the bet must Win or be Placed, as the case may be, in order that the client may win the bet.

37. Non-Runners

Where

- (a) a bet is a Double Event or Quinela or Exacta or Straight Forecast or a Doublet and is made at a fixed Starting Price or at Totalisator odds and one of the Horses named in such a bet is a non-runner who does not come under Starter’s Orders then, save as is mentioned in Rule 36, the bet will be treated as a bet to Win on the other Horse named in the bet.
- (b) a bet is an Accumulator and is made at a fixed Starting Price or at Totalisator odds and one or more of the Horses named in such bet is a non-runner, who does not come under Starter’s Orders then, save as it mentioned in Rule 36, the bet will be treated as an Accumulator on the other Horses named in the bet as if the said non-runners had never been named therein.

- (c) A bet is a Trifecta and is made at a fixed Starting Price or at Totalisator odds and one or more of the Horses named in such bet is a non-runner, who does not come under Starter's Orders then, save as is mentioned in Rule 36, the bet is incapable of acceptance by the Company and the relevant amount staked will be refunded.
38. All winnings and dividends are subject to any deduction authorized from time to time by the Government of Jamaica.
39. All bets on Overseas racing will be executed at a fixed Starting Price unless otherwise expressly requested in writing by the client and expressly agreed by the Company. In any instance where the bet is executed at a fixed Starting Price but no Starting Price is returned, the bet will be treated as having been made at Totalisator odds. Where it expressly agreed that any bet on United Kingdom or Irish Racing will be executed at Totalisator odds but no official Totalisator dividend is declared, the bet will be treated as having been made at a fixed Starting Price.
40. An offer of a bet on a Tricast may be made only on horse races run outside of Jamaica but will only be accepted if made at a fixed Starting Price. Where an offer of such a bet is accepted by the company and one of the Horses named in such bet is a non-runner who does not come under Starter's Orders, then the bet will be refunded. Where there is a boxed Tricast Bet (Perm Tricast with more than three horses) with one or more non-runners, then the portion of the Tricast Bets affected will be refunded and the valid portion will be accepted.
41. In Overseas Horse Racing
- (i) there will be no Quinela Betting on races with less than seven (7) runners;
 - (ii) there will be no Exacta Betting on races with less than four (4) runners,

- (iii) there will be no Tricast Betting on races with less than nine (9) runners,
 - (iv) there will be no Trifecta Betting on races with less than nine (9) runners,
 - (iv) for the purpose of this Rule, the number of runners in any race shall be the number of runners listed for such race on the Company's programme. In the case of non-runners, adjustments will be made to the betting criteria.
42. In the United Kingdom or Irish Horse Racing, subject to Rule 38 and 44, winning Place Bets at a fixed Starting Price will be paid at one-quarter of the Starting Price on a Win Bet for each of the first three (3) places if eight (8) or more runners come under Starter's Orders in the race and one quarter of the fixed Starting price on a Win bet for each of the first two (2) places if six (6) or seven (7) runners come under Starter's Orders. Where on any Place Bet at a fixed Starting Price there are less than six (6) runners who come under Starter's Orders in the race, the the bet will be refunded.
43. In a Handicap race in United Kingdom or Irish Horse Racing where there are sixteen (16) or more runners who come under Starter's Orders, winning Place Bets at a fixed Starting Price will be paid one-quarter of the fixed Starting Price on a Win Bet for each of the first four (4) places.
44. In the United Kingdom or Irish Horse Racing, the fixed Starting Price and Totalisator odds will, for the purposes of these Rules be the prices and odds as appear from The Sporting Life newspaper. In the event that any error is corrected in any issue of the Sporting Life newspaper, bets will be settled at the corrected price or odds. The advertised time of a race will be that contained in the Sporting Life newspaper or website on the morning of the race.

45. In respect of a bet on the United Kingdom or Irish Horse Racing, in the event of an objection, such bet will be settled in accordance with the Stewards decision at the Race Track where the event is held.

SECTION C

RULES FOR FIXED ODDS/SPORTS BETTING

General Rules

1. Betting with fixed odds can take place with the publication of the Program (List) that has a specified valid period. This Program lists all betting events, dates and time of said events, starting odds, betting instructions, special conditions, which may apply for a certain Program. It also contains details and information concerning these events, aiming to assist players' participation.
2. The Program is published through the Company's authorized network, and by any other means decided by the Company.
3. In cases where data or specific information regarding offered events is missing from the Program or mistakes are noticed or the distribution of the Program is late, the Company has the right to announce these matters in alternate media as approved by the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission e.g. newspaper publication or terminal message through the central computer system.
4. The period for taking bets with fixed odds, offered in the Program, starts with the activation in the Central Computer System of bet acceptance, and ends with the commencement of the last event stated in the Program.
5. Bets are accepted only during the Program's valid period and up to the date and time of the first betting event chosen by the player, as validated by the Central Computer System. The Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission will have 'read only' access to the central computer system.
6. In any case regarding the validity of bets, data registered in the Central Computer System prevails over any other data.
7. Fixed odds betting games are the selections a player can choose as a possible outcome for each of the offered events or group of events, as well as the quantity

of events a player can choose in order to create a betting line (column). The Company is responsible for deciding and publishing the value of a betting line.

8. Fixed odds betting games are offered with separate fixed odds for every selection or for a combination as a whole, as chosen by the player. Odds are presented in decimal format with two decimal points. The Company has the right to change odds at any given time. Starting odds are published in the Program.

Participation of Players in Fixed Odds Betting Games

9. Participation in fixed odds betting games is open to Players 18 years and over, under condition that Players accept these General Rules and Regulations completely and unconditionally, and also accept special rules and conditions decided by the Company and approved by the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission, which will be published in the Program at varying times.
10. In order for a player to participate in fixed odds betting games it is necessary to create at least one line, to make a payment either for the value of the line or lines produced, or if desired, to multiply this value many times. Payment is finalized after the Central Computer System has validated the bet, validity of which can be proven by a print out. This print out will contain the odds that were valid at the moment of validation; the player's other predictions and will also contain other elements which are necessary to render the bet unique.
11. It is the Company's responsibility to determine and inform all players through the Program, of the maximum amount of payment per bet combination or combinations for participating in a single fixed odds betting game. In the event the value of the bet exceeds the maximum amount determined by the Company, a bet will not be accepted.
12. In some fixed odds betting games it is possible to use "permutations", represented by coded combinations of lines. The Company informs, in every available way,

the “permutations” that can be used for each fixed odds betting game offered to players.

Bet Acceptance

13. The Company has the right to accept or reject any bet, at any time, without obligation to justify his decision.
14. If according to the Company’s discretion there are special reasons for creating a special agreement with a player e.g. High Stake Bets, a special procedure will apply. This will involve negotiations be held, to consider changing the player’s selections. Final agreement is certified by the validation of the bet by the Central Computer System.
15. A line that contains an event, which was postponed or called off, will be accepted only under conditions stated in these Rules.

Bet Cancellation

16. Cancellation is done only in special cases, according to the Company’s discretion. A bet can be cancelled within a period of up to five (5) minutes after it was accepted by the computerised system.
17. If for any reason cancellation of the bet cannot occur because the Central Computer System cannot automatically recognize the bet that is meant to be cancelled, then the cancellation will not take place and the Company bears no responsibility for this.
18. When a bet is cancelled all combinations included in the bet are cancelled as well, and the payment for the bet is returned to the player.

Results of Events

19. The successful predictions of the player’s selections is based on the official results announced by the governing body or Association that held the event. The results

will be communicated by Company through the point of sale terminals of the online computer system for all events in the Program that are organized in accordance with the rules and the official regulations of the game.

20. In the case of postponement or cancellation of one or more events, for which bets have been accepted, and before these changes were known and had been entered in the Central Computer System, the results of the events offered are determined on the basis of the rules contained within these regulations.

Winning Bets & Payout of Winnings

21. Each line entered in the Central Computer System, is a winning one, when all selected outcomes have been successfully predicted. In this case, a winning prize is paid to the player and is equal to the value of the line multiplied by all the odds, valid at the time of validation for that line. In the case of odds that are offered as a whole for a combination chosen by a player, the winning prize paid to the player is equal to the value of the line multiplied by the odds, valid at the time of validation, given for the combination.
22. Payout of winnings, in accordance with the previous paragraph, is done only after all events included in the bet have finished and after there is confirmation of the respective record in the Central Computer System.
23. The Company determines the maximum amount of winnings paid out in the sales network. The maximum payable at a Betting Office is Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000). Winnings between \$200,001 and \$500,000 will be paid at a Regional Retail Centre. Winnings \$500,001 and over will be paid at the Prize Payment Centre located on the 1st floor of the Sagikor Centre, 28 – 48 Barbados Avenue, Kingston 5.
24. In the case that there is an obvious mistake in the odds of the events on the basis of which the amount of winnings of a winning bet is calculated, the Company reserves the right to calculate the amount of winnings taking into account the

correct odds and to pay as a winning prize to the player the amount produced by that calculation. This payout is subject to certification by the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission.

25. If for whatever reason winning bets cannot be automatically recognized, the Company can apply special procedures e.g. central computer system report, assuming the Central Computer System can recognize these winning bets in some way. This is subject to observation by the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission.
26. In case of loss, complete or partial destruction of the betting bar encoded ticket or in general, when it is not possible to recover the winning bet, the Company relinquishes all responsibilities to the payout of winnings, or to provide any other form of compensation.
27. Winnings must be collected within **ninety (90) days** from the end of the valid period of the respective Program. Thereafter, the online central computer system information will be purged of these transactions.
28. In the case where the Company determines there is reasonable doubt that the outcome of an event has been tampered with, thus breaking rules and official regulations governing such events, or in the case where there is evidence questioning the credibility of an event, the Company reserves the right to suspend payout of winnings until the outcome of an investigation by the governing body or Association is completed and official results posted.

Maximum Winnings

29. The Company determines the maximum winnings per bet and/or per bet type and this is announced in the Program. If a certain player or group of players, placed identical or similar bets in order to avoid the Special Procedure for Bet Acceptance as stated in this document, the Rules for Bet Acceptance and the regulation as stated in this article, the Company in this case, has the right to apply

the maximum winnings, as defined within this article, to the total of the above bets. This is subject to notification to and approval by the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission. The public will be advised by at least a terminal message through the online computer system to all Bet Writers, before the event.

Disputes

30. A player who presents a validated winning bet that generates a message that “this is not recognized as winning” by the Central Computer System or registers the winnings as lower than what they should be, has the right to submit a complaint to the Company within six (6) days from the time when the results for all events of the Program were entered into the Central Computer System. Thereafter, the online central computer system information will be purged of these transactions.

Force Majeure, The Company’s Responsibility

31. In cases of force majeure, which makes it impossible to hold fixed odds betting games and impossible to payout winners, the Company bears no responsibility towards players, except in cases where automatic recognition of bets is possible, and in those cases the amount staked by players will be refunded.
32. Force majeure covers events that are beyond the control of the Company and which were unforeseeable and unavoidable. Any planning or application of defence measures by the Company cannot have possibly prevented these events. Force majeure covers events such as, but not limited to, natural disasters (Acts of God), floods, earthquakes, fires, war, strikes, embargo, acts of terror, etc.
33. The Company does not bear any responsibility for damages caused by any loss, totally or partially destroyed betting receipt, if such is provided, or for failure to retrieve or recover betting data.

Data Security

34. Data on all transactions entered into the Central Computer System, are kept for **ninety (90) days** at the Company's responsibility. Thereafter, the online central computer system information will be purged of these transactions.

Announcement of Rules

35. These rules as well as all terms and conditions of the holding of fixed odds betting games and the further description in detail in Section II of the present rules for all offered fixed odds betting games, are made known to players in every possible way, (Programs, other printed or electronic media), and from the moment of announcement are considered as an integral part of the official rules of the game.

SECTION E
SPECIFIC GAME RULES

General Provisions

1. For each possible outcome, stated in the Program, odds are offered with which players can calculate their winnings. Odds published in the Program or announced in any possible way are starting odds and the Company reserves the right to change them whenever it is deemed necessary.
2. The Company decides and publishes in the Program the rules concerning different types of bets. A betting line can include a number of predictions of event results, not related to the same event, depending on the Company's decision of minimum number of events that a player can choose in one betting line. This information is published in the Program.
3. The event times and dates published in the Program are the times and dates that are valid in the country/location that the Program has been published for.
4. In all cases of event cancellation, postponement or suspension the local time refers to the time of the country/location where the event takes place.
5. The player makes his predictions according to the instructions given by the Company. These instructions are announced in any possible way (e.g. Program, published materials and terminal messages through the online computer system).
6. The possibility and ways of combining in the same betting line a type of bet with any other type of bet, provided that these bets are not for the same event, are published in the Program. Exceptions will be cases where first goal scorer, any goal scorer and last goal scorer can be combined with each other, or Correct Score can be combined in a Scorecast with first goal scorer or any goal scorer or last goal scorer; or time of first goal can be combined with first goal scorer, any goal scorer and last goal scorer.

7. Regarding team sports, the team, determined by the Company as the home team, is on the left side of the Program, while the away team is on the right side of the Program. For the above-mentioned team sports, if there is a change in venue or a change in opponent and this is after the publication of the official Program, then all bets placed will be given odds of one (1.00).
8. Events chosen by the players can be combined in permutations (based on the number of event results in a line). Permutations, offered to players, are announced in every way possible. When players choose to use permutations, it is possible to indicate a banker (a standard event result) or bankers, which is a prediction included in all lines.
9. Betting lines that contain a prediction from a group or this prediction is in reference to an event regarding which any outcome cannot be verified, can still be taken into account with other predictions that have a minimum of two predictions or one if that prediction can be played as a single. In all other instances the line cannot stand as a bet and the amount paid is refunded once all other predictions are verified. If a line contains predictions that cannot be verified, they all receive odds of one (1.00) and the value of the line is refunded to players.
10. Betting lines that contains prediction of an event and which was inserted after the event had started, will be accepted, but the odds for that event will be one (1.00). In these cases the lines that have a minimum of two predictions, or one if that prediction can be played as a single, remain valid. Lines that do not fulfill the stated requirements do not participate in the game and the amount paid for them will be returned to the players after all games on which the player placed bets have ended.
11. In case the winning outcomes are more than the expected ones (case of dead heat), then the odds for each winning outcome are divided by the number of winning outcomes. The odds to be paid to the players, as a result of applying the present rule, cannot be less than 1.00.

12. In certain particular circumstances for which the Company may feel there are special reasons, certain bets offered, will be given odds of one (1.00). This is within the Company's exclusive rights.

Final Result of a Football Match

The player is asked to make a prediction of the final outcome of a certain football match.

13. The Company can, in any way possible, announce the advantage in goals for one of the two teams. In this case, a win for one team will be the result that takes into account and exceeds the goal advantage given to the other side. A draw is considered any win, which the difference of goals scored, in favour of one team is equal to the opponent's advantage. The advantage can be a decimal number and in this case it is not possible to have a draw as the outcome. The Company reserves the right to change the advantage at any time. Starting advantages are published in the Program. Advantages taken into consideration in order to accept a bet as winning, are ones that are valid at the moment of acceptance by the Central Computer System.
14. The results officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company and considered the final results. These are based on the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the match. There is a possibility, the final result can be, the result after extra time or the result when a 'golden goal' is scored or the result after a penalty shoot-out. If this is the case, it will be stated in the Program.
15. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a match was suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is played on a date (based on the event's local time) beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the

Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on the final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

16. If a match is suspended during the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the result at the time of suspension will be considered as final.
17. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the result valid, will be, the result at the final conclusion of the match.

Half-Time Result of a Football Match

The player is asked to predict the half-time result of a specific football match.

18. The half-time results officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company will be considered the final results of the first half of the match during the regular duration of the first half of the match, including time added on by the Referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages.
19. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a match was suspended during the first half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is played on a date (based on the event's local time) beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on the final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
20. If a match is suspended during the first half and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then

the valid half-time result will be the half-time result at the final conclusion of the first half of the match the following day.

21. If a match is suspended after the regular duration of the first half of the match, including time added on by the referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages, then the half-time result will be considered the result at the conclusion of the first half of the match.

Half-Time/Full-Time of a Football Match

The player is asked to predict the half-time result of a certain football match in combination with the final result of the same match.

22. The half-time/full-time results officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company and will be considered the final results. These are based on the result at half-time and the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the match. There is a possibility, the final result can be, the result after extra time or the result when a 'golden goal' is scored or the result after a penalty shoot-out. If this is the case, it will be stated in the Program.
23. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a match was suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is played on a date (based on the event's local time) beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on the final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
24. If a match is suspended during the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date

stated in the Program, then the half-time/full-time result at the time of suspension will be considered as final.

25. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the result valid, will be, the result at the final conclusion of the match the following day.

Correct Score of a Football Match

The player is asked to predict the correct score of a football match.

26. The correct score is the one released by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results, based on the outcome produced at the end of regular time of the match.
27. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a match was suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is played on a date (based on the event's local time) beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on the correct score will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
28. If a match is suspended during the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the correct score at the time of suspension will be considered as final correct score.
29. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the correct score valid, will be the score at the final conclusion of the match the following day.

First Goal Scorer of a Football Match

The player is asked to predict which football player will score the first goal during a football match.

30. The first goal scored, is the one scored during the 90 minutes of play, including time added on by the referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages. Extra time and penalty shoot-outs do not count for these bets.
31. Bets for scorers of the first goal who did not take part in the match or entered the match as a replacement for another player after the first goal was scored, will be given odds of one (1.00).
32. If the first goal is an “own goal”, it is not taken into account when deciding the first goal scored. An exception will be in cases where odds are offered for the first goal being an “own goal”. When it is disputed who scored the first goal, and if this first goal is an “own goal”, the official decision of the association holding the event will be taken as final.
33. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, after the first goal has been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the betting lines that include first scorer will be considered. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and a goal has not been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions for first scorer will be given odds of one (1.00).
34. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of first scorer will be based on the result at the time of suspension.

35. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of first goal scorer, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the following day.
36. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on first goal scorer of the match will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Last Goal Scorer in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict which football player will score the last goal during a football match.

37. The last goal scored is the one scored during the 90 minutes of play, including time added on by the referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages. Extra time and penalty shoot-outs do not count for these bets.
38. Bets for scorers of the last goal who did not take part in the match or was substituted by another player before the last goal was scored, will be given odds of one (1.00).
39. If the last goal is an "own goal", it is not taken into account when deciding the last goal scored. An exception will be in cases where odds are offered for the last goal being an "own goal". When it is disputed who scored the last goal, and if this last goal is an "own goal", the official decision of the Association holding the event will be taken as final.
40. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the

event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions for last scorer will be given odds of one (1.00).

41. If a match is suspended after the start of the second half and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions for last scorer will be based on the result at the time of suspension.
42. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of last goal scorer, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the next day.
43. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on last goal scorer of the match will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Any Goal Scorer in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict which football player will score during a football match.

44. Any goal scored is the one scored during the 90 minutes of play, including time added on by the Referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages. Extra time and penalty shoot-outs do not count for these bets.
45. Bets for scorers of any goal who did not take part in the match will be given odds of one (1.00).
46. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after one or more goals have been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the betting lines that include the predictions of

- scorer or scorers of goals already scored will be winning, while the predictions for other football players who did not score will be given odds of one (1.00). If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and a goal has not been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions for any goal scorer will be given odds of one (1.00).
47. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of first scorer will be based on the result at the time of suspension.
 48. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of any goal scorer, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the next day.
 49. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets on any goal scorer of the match will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
 50. Prediction for any goal scorer in a football match can be combined in one betting line with a prediction for first and/or last goal scorer of the same match. It is also allowed to combine in one betting line prediction for first goal scorer with a prediction for last goal scorer. One betting line cannot combine predictions regarding the same football player.

First Team to Score in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict the team to score the first goal in a football match.

51. The team that scored first as the result released by governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company and considered the final results, based on the outcome produced at the end of regular time of the match.
52. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after a goal has been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the betting lines that include the prediction for first team to score will be considered. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and a goal has not been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions for first team to score will be given odds of one (1.00).
53. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of first team to score will be based on the result at the time of suspension.
54. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the outcome for this bet, will be based on the result, at the final score of the match the next day.
55. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for the team to score first will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Team to Score or Not to Score in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict if one or both teams will score or not in a football match.

56. The team or the teams that scored or did not score in the match, will be determined by the result released by the governing body or Association holding the event and will be published by the Company and considered the final result, based on the outcome produced at the end of regular time of the match.
57. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after one team has scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the bets on the team that scored will be considered winning, while bets on this team not to score, will be considered losing. In this case, bets on all other outcomes will be given odds of one (1.00).
58. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after one team has scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the bets on both teams to score, or home team to score or away team to score will be considered winning, while bets on any other outcome will be considered losing.
59. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and a goal has not been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of any outcome for this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00).
60. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the winning outcome for this bet, will be based on the result at the time of suspension.

61. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the winning outcome for this bet, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the next day.
62. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for a team to score or not to score will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Total Number of Goals Scored in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict if the total number of goals scored in a football match is within a certain range.

63. The total number of goals scored in a football match is the sum of goals scored by both teams as officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results, based on the outcome produced at the end of regular time of the match.
64. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' bets for the total number of goals scored will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
65. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of goals already scored is within the

higher range, then the predictions regarding this range will be considered winning, while any other prediction regarding other ranges will be a losing bet.

66. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of goals already scored is within a range below the higher range, then all predictions regarding this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00).
67. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number of goals scored at the time of suspension will be considered as the final total number of goals scored.
68. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number of valid goals scored will be the number of goals scored at the final conclusion of the match the next day.

Goals Scored in a Football Match “Under – Over” a Specified Limit

The player is asked to predict if the total number of goals scored in a football match is “under” or “over” a limit published in the Program.

69. The total number of goals scored in a football match is the sum of goals scored by both teams as officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results based on the outcome produced at the end of the regular time of a match.
70. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the

home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for "Under-Over" will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

71. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of goals already scored is greater than the limit published in the Program, then the outcome "over" is considered the winning outcome while the outcome "under" is the losing outcome.
72. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of goals already scored is less than the limit published in the Program, then both outcomes - "over" and "under" – are given odds of one (1.00).
73. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number of goals scored at the time of suspension will be considered as the final total number of goals scored.
74. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number of valid goals scored will be the number of goals scored at the final conclusion of the match the next day.

Goals Scored in the First Half of a Football Match “Under – Over” a Specified Limit

The player is asked to predict if the total number of goals scored in the first half of a football match is “under” or “over” a limit published in the Program.

75. The total number of goals scored in the first half of a football match is the sum of goals scored by both teams as officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results based on the outcome produced at the end of the regular time of the first half of a match.
76. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' bets for “Under-Over” will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
77. If a match is suspended before the end of the first half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of goals already scored is greater than the limit published in the Program, then the outcome “over” is considered the winning outcome while the outcome “under” is the losing outcome.
78. If a match is suspended before the end of the first half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of goals already scored is less than the limit published in the Program, then both outcomes - “over” and “under” – are given odds of one (1.00).

79. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number of goals scored in the first half will be the number of goals scored in the first half at the final conclusion of the match the next day.

**Total Number of Cards (Yellow or Red),
Total Number of Penalties in a Football Match**

The player is asked to predict if the total number of cards (yellow or red) or if the total number of penalties given in a football match is “under” or “over” a limit published in the Program.

80. The total number of cards (yellow or red) or the total number of penalties given in a football is the sum of cards (yellow or red) or the sum of penalties given to both teams as officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results based on the outcome produced at the end of the regular time of a match. Extra time and penalty shoot-outs do not count for these bets.
81. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for the total number of cards (yellow or red) or the total number of penalties will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
82. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of cards (yellow or red) or the total number of penalties already given is greater than the limit published in the Program, then the outcome “over” is considered the winning outcome while the outcome “under” is the losing outcome.

83. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program and if at the moment of suspension the total number of cards (yellow or red) or the total number of penalties already given is less than the limit published in the Program, then both outcomes - “over” and “under” – are given odds of one (1.00).
84. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number cards (yellow or red) or the total number of penalties given at the time of suspension will be considered as the final total number of cards (yellow or red) or the final total number of penalties given.
85. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the total number of cards (yellow or red) or the total number of penalties given will be the number cards (yellow or red) or the number of penalties given at the final conclusion of the match the next day.

Time of First Goal in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict the range of times the first goal will be scored in a football match.

86. The first goal scored is the one scored during the 90 minutes of play, including time added on by the Referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages. Extra time and penalty shoot-outs do not count for these bets.
87. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after the first goal has been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the

date stated in the Program, then the betting lines that include prediction regarding time of first goal will be considered.

88. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and a goal has not been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions for time of first goal will be given odds of one (1.00).
89. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of time of first goal will be based on the result at the time of suspension.
90. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of the time of first goal, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the next day.
91. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
92. Prediction for the Time of First Goal in a football match can be combined in one betting line with a prediction for first or last or any goal scorer of the same match. One betting line cannot combine predictions regarding the same football player. In the event that the first or last or any goal scorer is given odds of one (1.00), then the bet will be examined as a bet on the Time of First Goal. In the case where the Time of first goal is combined with a prediction for first or last or any

goal scorer and if the Time of First Goal have been given odds of one (1.00), then all bets will be refunded to the players i.e. a given odds of one (1:00).

Scorecasts

In this bet, the player is asked to make a prediction on which football player will score in a football match: the first goal or any goal or the last goal or time of first goal scored; in combination with the correct score of the match.

93. The first, the last or any goal scored are the ones scored during the 90 minutes of play, including time added on by the referee in respect of injuries and other stoppages. The correct score is the one the governing body or Association holding the event releases, will be published by the Company and considered the final results, based on the outcome produced at the end of regular time of the match. Extra time and penalty shoot-outs do not count for these bets.
94. Bets for scorer of the first goal who did not take part in the match or entered the match as a replacement for another player after the first goal was scored, will be given odds of one (1.00). Bets for scorers of any goal who did not take part in the match will be given odds of one (1.00). Bets for scorers of the last goal who did not take part in the match or was substituted by another player before the last goal was scored, will be given odds of one (1.00). In these cases, bets on Scorecasts will be examined as bets on the Correct Score of a football match.
95. If the first goal or any goal or last goal is an “own goal”, it is not taken into account when deciding the first goal or any goal or last goal scored. An exception will be in cases where odds are offered for the first goal or any goal or last goal being an “own goal”. When it is disputed who scored the first goal or any goal or last goal, and if this first goal or any goal or last goal is an “own goal”, the official decision of the governing body or Association holding the event will be taken as final.
96. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after the first goal has been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the

match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the betting lines that include Scorecasts regarding first goal or any goal scorer will be examined as bets on First or Any Goal Scorer.

97. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half and a goal has not been scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the predictions on Scorecasts will be given odds of one (1.00).
98. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction on Scorecasts will be based on the result at the time of suspension.
99. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction on Scorecasts, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the next day.
100. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for Scorecasts will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Winner of a Football Competition
Semi-Final Winner of a Football Competition
Winners of Qualifying Phases of Varying Football Competitions

The player is asked to predict which team, will come first in a certain football competition or who will be the winner in the semi-finals of a football competition or the winner of certain qualifying phases (i.e. group phase or other) of a football competition.

101. Determining the winner of the competition or the winner of the semi-final or the winner of a certain round of a competition is in accordance with the rules for the competition as organized by the governing body of the competition. This is irrespective of how this competition is decided, be it points rating, finals (including possible over time, or a possible penalty shoot-out), a playoff game to qualify, or a draw.
102. Bets received on a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
103. Bets received on a team that for any reason did not participate in the competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
104. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Participants in the Final of a Football Competition

The player is asked to predict the teams that will get to the final of a certain football competition.

105. In determining the pair of teams to reach the final, the decision is in accordance with the rules for the competition as organized by the governing body of the competition. This is irrespective of how these teams reached the final, which can include a penalty shoot-out.
106. Bets received on a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.

107. Bets received on a team that for any reason did not participate in the competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
108. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Top Scorer of a Football Competition

The player is asked to predict which football player will score the most goals in a certain football competition.

109. Determining the top scorer in a certain competition is done in accordance with the rules set down by the competition's organizing body and the results as they developed within the framework of the competition, unless otherwise stated in the Program.
110. When determining the top scorer of a competition, the goals scored during extra-time are included, but the goals scored in a penalty shoot-out are not taken into account.
111. Bets received on football players who did not participate in the competition will not be considered as winning and will be given odds of one (1:00).
112. Bets received on football players whose team was disqualified from the competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
113. If the competition is cancelled, any prediction for top scorer will be given odds of one (1.00).
114. If there are two or more players that have scored the same number of goals and are considered top scorers of the competition, the odds for each of them is divided by the total number of top scorers.

Live Betting on Final Result of a Football Match

The player is asked to make a prediction of the final outcome of a certain football match, placing his bets while the match is being played.

115. In this type of bet, cancellations are not allowed. Live betting starts with the announcement, using a Program or message through the online computer system to the terminal, of starting odds a few minutes before the kick-off of the match and ends with the ending of regular time of the match.
116. Prediction for this bet cannot be combined with any other event or type of bet, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
117. The result officially announced by the Company will be considered the final result, based on the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the match. Extra time and penalty shoot-out do not count for this bet.
118. If a match was suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match was not played within three hours, players' bets on the final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
119. If a match is suspended during the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played within three hours, then the result at the time of suspension will be considered as the final result.

Live Betting During Extra Time or Penalty Shoot-Out on Which Team Will Qualify for the Next Round or on the Winning Team of a Football Final

The player is asked to make a prediction on which team will qualify for the next round or on the winning team of the final of a football competition, placing his bets only during extra time or during the penalty shoot-out.

120. In this type of bet cancellations are not allowed.
121. Prediction for this bet cannot be combined with any other event or type of bet, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
122. Live betting starts with the announcement via the Program or message through the online computer system to the terminal, of starting odds after the end of the regular time of a match and ends with the determination of the team that qualified to the next round or the winner of the final.
123. If a match was suspended during extra time or during penalty shoot-out, and the time left from the suspension was not played within three hours, players' bets on which team will qualify for the next round or on the winning team of a football final will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Final Result of a Basketball Game

The player is asked to make a prediction on the final outcome of a certain basketball game.

124. The Company announces via the Program or message through the online computer system to the terminal, the advantage in points (handicap) in favour of one of the two teams. In this case, a win for one team will be the result that takes into account and exceeds the point advantage given to the other side. The advantage can be a decimal number. The Company reserves the right to change the advantage at any time, with the prior approval of the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission. Starting advantages are published in the Program.

Winning advantages are ones that are valid at the moment of acceptance of the bet by the Central Computer System. Handicap points are only applicable for the final result of a game and are not used for the determination of 'Under-Over' bet outcomes.

125. The results officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company and considered the final results. These are based on the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the game. There might be games where the final result will include overtime periods played. If this is the case, then it will be stated in the Program.
126. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a game was suspended before the end of regulation time or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Half-Time/Full-Time Result of a Basketball Game

The player is asked to make a prediction on the half-time result in combination with the final result of a basketball game.

127. The Company announces via the Program or message through the online computer system to the terminal, the advantage in points in favour of one of the two teams for half-time result and final result. In this case, a win for one team will be the result that takes into account and exceeds the point advantage given to the other side. The advantage can be a decimal number. The Company reserves the right to change the advantage at any time with the prior approval of the Betting, Gaming & Lotteries Commission. Starting advantages are published in the Program. Winning advantages are ones that are valid at the moment of acceptance of the bet by the Central Computer System.

128. The results for half-time and full-time officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company and considered the final results. These are based on the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the game. There might be games where the final result will include overtime periods played. If this is the case, then it will be stated in the Program.
129. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a game was suspended before the end of regulation time or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' bets for half-time / full-time result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Half-Time Result of a Basketball Game

The player is asked to make a prediction on the result of the regular half-time of a basketball game.

130. The Company announces in via the Program or message through the online computer system to the terminal, the advantage in points in favour of one of the two teams for half-time result. In this case, a win for one team will be the result that takes into account and exceeds the point advantage given to the other side. The advantage can be a decimal number. The Company reserves the right to change the advantage at any time. Starting advantages are published in the Program. Winning advantages are ones that are valid at the moment of validation by the Central Computer System.
131. The result for half-time officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event will be published by the Company and considered the final result. This will be based on the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the first half of the game.

132. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a game was suspended before the end of regulation time or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for the half time result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Total Number of Points Scored in a Basketball Game, Total Number of Points Scored by a Certain Basketball Player in a Basketball Game, Total Number of Points Scored by a Certain Team in a Basketball Game, "Under – Over" a Specified Limit

The player is asked to predict if the total number of points scored by both teams in a basketball game or the total number of points scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game or whether the total number of points scored by a certain team in a basketball game will be "under" or "over" a limit or within a range published in the Program.

133. The total number of points scored by both teams in a basketball game, the total number of points scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game, the total number of points scored by a certain team in a basketball game are the ones officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results based on the outcome produced at the end of the regular time of a game. There might be games where overtime periods played will be taken into account. If this is the case, then it will be stated in the Program.
134. Bets on basketball players who did not take part in the game, will be given odds of one (1.00).
135. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the

Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for "Under-Over" will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

136. If a game was suspended and if at the moment of suspension the total number of points already scored by both teams in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain team in a basketball game is greater than the limit published in the Program, then the outcome "over" is considered the winning outcome while the outcome "under" is the losing outcome.
137. If a match was suspended and if at the moment of suspension the total number of points already scored by both teams in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain team in a basketball game is less than the limit published in the Program, then both outcomes - "over" and "under" – are given odds of one (1.00).

Total Number of Points Scored in a Basketball Game, Total Number of Points Scored by a Certain Basketball Player in a Basketball Game, Total Number of Points Scored by a Certain Team in a Basketball Game within a Specified Range

The player is asked to predict if the total number of points scored by both teams in a basketball game or if the total number of points scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game or if the total number of points scored by a certain team in a basketball game is within a range published in the Program.

138. The total number of points scored by both teams in a basketball game, the total number of points scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game, the total number of points scored by a certain team in a basketball game are the ones officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results based on the outcome produced at the end of the regular time of a game. There might be games

where overtime periods played will be taken into account. If this is the case, then it will be stated in the Program.

139. Bets on basketball players who did not take part in the game, will be given odds of one (1.00).
140. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' predictions for this type of bet will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
141. If a game was suspended before the regular scheduled end of the game and if at the moment of suspension the total number of points already scored by both teams in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain team in a basketball game is within the higher range, then the predictions regarding this range will be considered winning, while any other prediction regarding other ranges will be losing.
142. If a game was suspended before the regular scheduled end of the game and if at the moment of suspension the total number of points already scored by both teams in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game or the total number of points already scored by a certain team in a basketball game is within a range below than higher range, then all predictions regarding this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00).

‘Head to Head’ in a Basketball Game

The player is asked to predict which two basketball players will score more points than the other in a basketball game.

143. The total number of points scored by a certain basketball player in a basketball game is the one that is officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results based on the outcome produced at the end of regular time of a game. There might be games where overtime periods played will be taken into account. If this is the case, then it will be stated in the Program.
144. If Bets are received on a basketball player who, for any reason, did not participate in the game, then both players will be given odds of one (1.00).
145. In the case that both basketball players have scored the same amount of points, then both basketball players will be given odds of one (1.00).
146. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' predictions for this type of bet will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00). If a game is cancelled or postponed for more than one calendar day beyond the day stated in the Program (in local time); in all these circumstances, players' bets will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Winner of a Basketball Competition
Winner of the Semi-Final of a Basketball Competition
Winner of a Group in a Basketball Competition

The player is asked to predict which team will come first in a certain basketball competition or who will be the winner in the semi-finals of a basketball competition or the group winner of certain qualifying phases of a basketball competition.

147. Determining the winner of the competition or the winner of the semi-final or the winner of a certain round of a competition is in accordance with the rules for the competition as organized by the governing body of the competition. This is irrespective of how this competition is decided, be it points rating, finals (including possible overtime), a playoff game to qualify, or a draw.
148. Bets received on a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
149. Bets received on a team that for any reason did not participate in competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
150. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Participants in the Final of a Basketball Competition

The player is asked to predict the teams that will get to the final of a certain basketball competition.

151. In determining the pair of teams to reach the final, the decision is in accordance with the rules for the competition as organized by the governing body of the competition. This is irrespective of how these teams reach the final, which can include over time.
152. Bets received on a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.

153. Bets received on a team that for any reason did not participate in competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
154. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Top Scorer of a Basketball Competition

Top Scorer or Best Rebounder or Player with the most assists of a Basketball Competition or in any part of it - Team Top Scorer or Team Best Rebounder or Player with the most assists among the players of one team

The player is asked to predict which Basketball player will score the most points or will gain the most rebounds or will make the most assists in a certain Basketball competition or in any part of it. The player may also predict which Basketball player among the players of one team will score the most points or will gain the most rebounds or will make the most assists in a certain Basketball competition or in any part of it.

155. Determining the top scorer or the best rebounder or the player with the most assists or the team top scorer or team best rebounder or player with the most assists among the players of one team in a certain competition or in any part of it is done in accordance with the rules set down by the competition's organizing body, unless otherwise stated in the Program.
156. When determining the top scorer or the best rebounder or the player with the most assists or the team top scorer or team best rebounder or player with the most assists among the players of one team in a certain competition or in any part of it, the points scored during possible over-time are included.
157. Bets received on basketball players who did not participate in the entire competition for which bets have been received, will not be considered as winning.
158. Bets received for a certain basketball game on basketball player who was not included in the team's roster (i.e. he is not "suited up") will be given odds of one

- (1.00) since the mentioned basketball player is considered that he did not take part in the game.
159. Bets received on basketball players whose team did not qualify for the competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
 160. If the competition is cancelled, any prediction for top scorer or best rebounder or the player with the most assists or any prediction for Team top scorer or Team Best rebounder or Player with the most assists among the players of one team will be given odds of one (1.00).
 161. If there are two or more players that have scored the same amount of points or rebounds or assists and are considered top scorers or best rebounders or players with the most assists or team top scorers or team best rebounders or players with the most assists among the players of one team in a certain competition or in a part of it, the odds for each of them are divided by the total number of top scorers or total number of best rebounders or total number of players with the most assists or total number of team top scorers or total number of team best rebounder or total number of players with the most assists among the players of one team.

The Winning Driver in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll Position Race or a Grand Prix Race or in a World Rally Championship (WRC)

The player is asked to predict which driver will take first place in a Formula One Grand Prix or Moto GP Poll position race or a Grand Prix race or in a WRC.

162. The drivers' finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony, or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the official position will be done on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. In case there is more than one driver sharing first place (as winners), then the odds for them will be divided by the number of drivers that were winners. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions by the governing body, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this example, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver, which may change the finishing positions.
163. Bets received on a driver who for any reason, did not participate in a competition for pole position, will be given odds of one (1.00).
164. Starting time of a Grand Prix Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. Bets received for any driver who for whatever reason did not participate in the race will be given odds of one (1.00).
165. In case a race is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program

First and Second Place in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll Position Race or a Grand Prix Race or in a WRC

The player is asked to predict which drivers, will be in first and second place in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll position race or a Grand Prix race or in a WRC.

166. The drivers' finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony, or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the official position will be done on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. In case there is more than one driver sharing the same place, thus resulting in more than one pair of first and second drivers, the odds for the pair will be divided by the total number of pairs. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver, which may change the finishing positions.
167. Bets received on a pair of drivers who, for any reason, did not participate in a competition for pole position, will be given odds of one (1.00).
168. The starting time of a Grand Prix Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. Bets received for any driver who, for whatever reason, did not participate in the race, will be given odds of one (1.00).
169. A race that is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program,

‘Head to Head’ in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll Position Race or in a WRC

The player is asked to predict which of two drivers, will finish in a better position than the other, in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll position race or in a WRC.

170. The drivers’ finishing positions are the positions that are announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results
171. In case one driver of the pair is not classified based on the time achieved, the prediction for this driver will be considered losing, while the prediction for the other driver will be considered winning.
172. In case both drivers are not classified, then both drivers will be given odds of one (1.00).
173. In case one driver of the pair did not participate in the competition for Pole position then both drivers will be given odds of one (1.00).
174. After the announcement of the official results by the governing body or Association holding the event, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver, which may change the results.
175. A race that is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program.

‘Head to Head’ in a Formula One or in a Moto GP Grand Prix Race or in a WRC

The player is asked to predict which of two drivers, will finish in a better position than the other in a Formula One or in a Moto GP Grand Prix race or in a WRC.

176. The drivers’ finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony, or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the official position will be done on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver, which may change the finishing positions.
177. In case both drivers are not classified, the winner will be considered the driver which completed more laps. In case both drivers have completed the same total number of laps, then both drivers will be given odds of one (1.00).
178. The starting time of a Grand Prix Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. In case one of the drivers of the pair for whatever reason did not participate in the race, both drivers will given odds of one (1.00).
179. A race that is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program.

Placing of a Driver in First Two Positions (or in First Three, or in First Four, or in First Six, or in First Eight) Positions in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll Position Race or in a Formula One or Moto GP Grand Prix Race or in a WRC

The player is asked to predict if a driver will be placed in one of first two positions (or in one of first three or in one of first four, one in first six or one in first eight positions) in a Formula One or Moto GP Poll position race or in a Formula One or Moto GP Grand Prix race or in a WRC.

180. The drivers' finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the official position will be done on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver, which may change the finishing positions.
181. In the instance where more than one driver finishes simultaneously in a prize winning position for this type of bet and if the total number of the winning drivers is greater than the expected one, then the odds of each driver is multiplied by a fraction. The numerator of this fraction will be the total number of events (drivers) that have yet to be paid in order to complete the number of positions payable, while the denominator of the fraction will consist of the number of drivers that finished simultaneously in the same position.
182. Bets received on a driver who, for any reason, did not participate in a competition for pole position, will be given odds of one (1.00).
183. The starting time of a Grand Prix Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. Bets received for any driver who

participated in the competition for pole position, but for whatever reason did not participate in the race will not be considered as winning.

184. A race that is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program.

**The Winning Driver of the Formula One or Moto GP World
Championship or WRC
The Winning Team of the Formula One or Moto GP World
Championship or WRC**

The player is asked to predict which driver or team will occupy first place in the Formula One or Moto GP World Championship or WRC.

185. The winning drivers or teams are the official winners announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results irrespective of how the winning positions are determined.
186. Bets received on a driver or team, who for whatever reason, was disqualified or withdrew from the competition, are not winning bets unless otherwise stated in the Program.
187. Bets received for any driver or team who for whatever reason did not participate in the competition will be given odds of one (1.00).
188. If the Championship is cancelled all bets will be given odds of one (1.00).

First Driver to Retire in a Formula One or Moto GP Grand Prix Race

The player is asked to predict which driver will retire first in a Formula One or Moto GP Grand Prix race.

189. The drivers' finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony, or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the

official position will be done on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this example, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver which may change the finishing positions.

190. In case two or more drivers simultaneously withdraw from the race then the odds of each one is divided by the number of drivers that withdrew simultaneously. Two or more drivers that did not classify are considered to have withdrawn simultaneously if they have completed the same number of laps in the Grand Prix race, irrespective of the total distance they achieved and irrespective of the withdrawal time and/or the position they occupied at the time of withdrawal.
191. The starting time of a Grand Prix, Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. Bets received for any driver who for whatever reason did not participate in the race will be given odds of one (1.00).
192. In case a race is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program

Group Betting in a Formula One or Moto GP/Grand Prix Race

The player is asked to predict which driver among the drivers offered in the group will finish a Formula One or Moto GP/Grand Prix race in a better position than the other drivers from the group.

193. The drivers' finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony, or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the official position will be done on the basis of the report announced by the

organising body of the competition. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this example, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver which may change the finishing positions.

194. In the case where none of the drivers in the group classify, the winner is considered the driver who has completed the most laps. If two or more drivers have not qualified and have completed the same number of laps then the odds for each one is divided by the number of drivers who have completed the same number of laps. If all drivers have completed the same number of laps, then they all receive odds of one (1.00).
195. The starting time of a Grand Prix/ Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. Bets received for any driver who for whatever reason did not participate in the race, then all choices for the group which this driver is in, will be given odds of one (1.00).
196. In case a race is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program

Fastest Lap in a Formula One or Moto GP/Grand Prix Race

The player is asked to predict the driver that drives the fastest lap in a Formula One or Moto GP Grand Prix race.

197. The fastest lap in a Formula One or Moto GP/Grand Prix race is defined on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. After the announcement of official results, any change that may occur will not be taken into

consideration. An example, and not limited to just this example, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver which may change the official results.

198. The starting time of a Grand Prix/Formula One or Moto GP race is considered the starting time of the warm-up lap from the moment the driver takes up his position in the Grid. Thus any driver that takes up a position for the warm-up lap is considered to have taken part in the race. Bets received for any driver who for whatever reason did not participate in the race will be given odds of one (1.00).
199. In case a race is cancelled, postponed or suspended, and is not held within 36 hours, all predictions of players concerning this bet, will be given odds of one (1.00), unless otherwise stated in the Program

Number of Wins per Driver or Team in the Formula One or Moto GP World Championship

The player is asked to predict the number of wins that a driver or team will have during the Formula One or Moto GP World Championship.

200. The number of wins per driver or team is the number of wins officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results at the end of the Championship.
201. Bets received on a driver or team, who for whatever reason, was disqualified or withdrew from the competition, are not winning bets unless otherwise stated in the Program.
202. Bets received for any driver or team who for whatever reason did not participate in the competition will be given odds of one (1.00).
203. If the Championship is cancelled all bets will be given odds of one (1.00).

Final Result or Exact Result of Sport/Games (besides Football).

The player is asked to predict the final or the exact result of a sport/game excluding football. These sports or games may include Tennis, Volleyball, Hand Ball, Water Polo or any other sport whose results are represented in goals or sets.

204. The exact result of a game is the result achieved in goals or sets at the end of normal time of the game, if normal time is defined. Extra time or any other form of declaring a winner following extra time will not be taken into account.
205. The winning outcome of the sport or game is determined according to the regulations of the relevant organiser of the event, the results as they developed within the framework of the sport or game competition and as these results are announced by the organising body of the competition/event.
206. In the event of cancellation, postponement or final suspension of a game before the regulated scheduled ending of the game or cancellation, postponement or final suspension of the game or if there is a change in venue or a change in opponent and this is after the publication of the official Program, then all bets placed will be given odds of one (1.00).

Result of a Sports or Non-Sporting Event “Under – Over” a specified limit or within a specified range

The player is asked to predict the result of a sports event as a total number of goals or points or sets or points rating or in any other form. These sports games may include football, hockey, basketball, volleyball, tennis, handball, water polo or any other sport. The player’s prediction may also refer to an athlete or team regarding the result or the record that will be achieved by this athlete or team in a sports event (game, match, group, phase of a competition, competition) such as, but not limited to, the finishing position, the time or any other statistical measure of the sporting event. **The specified limits or the ranges of predictions are announced in the Program for betting selection.** Especially for football, the current paragraph **does not cover** the cases of bets on total number (“Under” or “Over” or within a range) of goals, cards – yellow or red -, penalties of a

certain football match that are regulated in the relevant paragraphs specific for these bet types. Also, specifically for basketball the current paragraph **does not cover** the cases of bets on total number (“Under - Over” or within a range) of points scored in a game or in a part of it or by a certain player or team in a game or in a part of it that are regulated in the relevant paragraphs specific for these bet types.

207. The winning outcome is determined according to the regulations of the relevant organiser of the event, the results as they developed within the framework of the sports event competition and as these results are announced by the organising body of the competition.
208. Bets received on athletes or participants or teams that for whatever reason, were disqualified or quit the sports event, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
209. Bets received on athletes or participants or teams that for whatever reason did not participate in competition will be given odds of one (1.00).
210. In case the sports event is finally suspended, all bets will convert to odds of one (1.00), except if at the moment of suspension the winner has been determined (a winning outcome already exists).
211. If the sports event is suspended and restarted and concluded, then the result valid, will be, the result at the final conclusion of the event.

Choosing a Winning Athlete or Team

For type of bets where a player is asked to predict the winning athlete or team in a competition such as, but not limited to Tennis, Hand Ball, Volleyball Water Polo etc.

212. The winning athlete or team of the competition or part of it, is determined according to the regulations of the relevant organiser of the competition, and the results as they developed within the framework of the competition, irrespective of how the competition is decided, be it but not limited to, points rating, finals (including possible overtime, or a possible penalty shoot-out), playoff game or games, or a draw.
213. Bets received on an athlete or a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
214. Bets received on an athlete or a team that for any reason did not participate in competition will be given odds of one (1.00).
215. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Participants in a Competition (Athletes or Team)

For type of bets where player is asked to predict which athletes or teams will participate in a specific competition such as, but not limited to, Tennis, Hand Ball, Volleyball Water Polo etc.,

216. Qualification of athletes or teams to a specific competition or part of it is determined according to the regulations of the relevant organiser of the competition and the results as they developed within the framework of the competition, irrespective of how these athletes or teams qualified, which can include extra time or a penalty shoot-out.

217. Bets received on athletes or teams that for whatever reason, were disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
218. Bets received on athletes or teams that for whatever reason did not participate in competition will be given odds of one (1.00).
219. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Group in Which the Most Goals Scored

The player is asked to predict, from a specified number of groups, in which group of football teams the most goals will be scored.

220. The group, in which the maximum sum of goals is scored, is the one stated by the governing body or Association holding the event, published by the Company and it is determined according to the final results produced at the end of regular time of all matches played by the teams participating in each group.
221. If there are two or more groups that have scored the same number of goals and this number of goals is considered the maximum number of goals scored for this type of bet, as stated by the governing body or Association holding the event, the odds for each of these groups are divided by the total number of the groups in which scored the same number of goals.
222. If the competition is cancelled, any prediction for the group re the maximum numbers of goals scored will be given odds of one (1.00).

Group From Which the Winner of a Competition Will Come From

The player is asked to predict, from a specified number of groups, the group from which the winner of a competition will come from.

223. The group from which the winner of a competition will come from, is the one stated by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published

by the Company and it is determined in accordance with the rules of the competition.

224. If the competition is cancelled, any prediction for this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00).

Round of a Football Competition, At Which a Team Will Be Knocked Out or Eliminated

The player is asked to predict the round of a football competition, at which a certain football team will be knocked out or for whatever reason was eliminated.

225. Determining the round of the competition at which a certain football team was knocked out or eliminated is in accordance with the rules the competition is organized by the governing body of the competition. This is irrespective of how this competition is decided, be it points rating, finals (including possible over time, or a possible penalty shoot-out), a playoff game to qualify, or a draw.
226. Bets received on a team that for any reason did not participate in competition for example due to disqualification, will be given odds of one (1.00).
227. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Winning Team of a Football Match During Extra Time in Group Competitions

The player is asked to make a prediction on which team will win a football match during extra time.

228. The winning team is the one officially stated be the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and is based on the final outcome produced during the extra time of the match.
229. If the result of the regular time of the match is not a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time will be considered non-winning.

230. If the result after extra time is a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time will be considered non-winning.
231. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a match was suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is played on a date (based on the event's local time) beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
232. If a match is suspended during the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the result at the time of suspension will be considered as final. In this case, if the final result is not a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time will be considered non – winning. The final result will be a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time are valid and will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
233. If a match is suspended, and re-started (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the valid result, will be the result at the final conclusion of the match, as stated by the governing body or Association holding the event. In this case, if the final result is not a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time will be considered non-winning. If the final result is a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during extra time will be valid and be judged after the conclusion of the extra time of the match.

234. If a match was suspended during extra time and the time left from the suspension was not played within three hours, players' bets on the winning team of a football match will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
235. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Winning Team of a Football Match During A Penalty Shoot-Out in Group Competitions

The player is asked to make a prediction on which team will win a football match after the penalty shoot-out.

236. The winning team is the one officially announced as stated by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and is based on the final outcome produced during penalty shoot-out of the match.
237. If the result of the regular time or the extra time of the match is not a draw ("X"), players' bets on the winning team of a football match during penalty shoot-out will be considered non-winning.
238. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a match was suspended before the start of the second half, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is played on a date (based on the event's local time) beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' bets on the winning team of a football match during penalty shoot-out will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
239. If a match is suspended during the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the result at the time of suspension will be considered

as final. In this case, if the final result is not a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during penalty shoot-out will be considered non-winning. If the final result is a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during penalty shoot-out will be valid and accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

240. If a match is suspended, and restarted (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the result valid, will be the result at the final conclusion of the match. In this case, if the final result is not a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during penalty shoot-out will be considered non-winning. If the final result is a draw (“X”), players’ bets on the winning team of a football match during penalty shoot-out will be valid and judged after the conclusion of the extra time and/or the penalty shoot-out of the match.
241. If a match was suspended during extra time or during penalty shoot-out and the time left from the suspension was not played within three hours, players’ bets on the winning team of a football match will be accepted but the all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).
242. In case the competition is cancelled for whatever reason, all bets will be converted to odds of one (1.00).

Athlete or Team That Wins the Highest Number of Medals, the Highest Number of Wins, the Highest Number of Points in a Competition

The player is asked to predict the athlete or team that will collect the highest total number of medals or the highest number of medals for a certain category, or the highest number of wins or the highest number of points, in a competition (the entire competition or a part of it in one or more sports or disciplines) such as, but not limited to, Tennis, Hand Ball, Volleyball, Water Polo competition, Olympic games, Grand Prix etc.

243. The results of the athlete or team in the competition (the entire competition or a part of it in one or more sports or disciplines) is determined according to the

regulations of the relevant organiser of the competition, and the results as they are developed within the framework of the competition. In case there is more than one athlete or team sharing the same number of medals or the same number of medals of a certain category, the same number of wins, or the same number of points, thus resulting in more than one winning outcomes, the odds for each one of the athletes or the teams sharing the same number of medals or the same number of medals of a certain category, or the same number of wins, or the same number of points, will be divided by the total number of the athletes or the teams sharing the same number of medals or the same number of medals of a certain category, the same number of wins, or the same number of points.

244. Bets received on an athlete or a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
245. Bets received on an athlete or a team that for any reason did not participate in competition will be given odds of one (1.00).
246. In case the competition is suspended for whatever reason, any prediction for this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00) unless at the moment of suspension there is a winning outcome (an outcome or result that could not be changed even if the competition was continued and completed as stated by the governing body or Association holding the event).

Placing of a Team in a Certain Position or in a Range of Positions or in a Qualifying Position in a Football Competition or in a Certain Stage of a Football Competition

The player is asked to predict if a team will be placed in a certain position (i.e. team to be placed in the 1st position) or in a range of positions (i.e. team to be placed in one of position 4-6) or in a qualifying position (i.e. team to be placed in one of positions 1-2 in the group and qualify for the next round, if positions 1 and 2 are qualifying positions) in a football competition or in a certain stage of a football competition.

247. The teams' finishing positions are the positions that are valid during the prize award ceremony, or if for any reason, the prize award ceremony is not held, the official position held will be on the basis of the report announced by the organising body of the competition. After the prize award ceremony or announcement of official finishing positions, any change that may occur will not be taken into consideration. An example, and not limited to just this, is the decision to disqualify a certain driver, which may change the finishing positions.
248. The teams' finishing positions are the positions that are determined according to the results officially announced by the organizer of the competition and the regulations applied by the organising body of the competition.
249. The number of qualifying positions in a certain stage of a football competition (i.e. group phase) is decided by the organising body of the competition and at Company's discretion can be announced in the Programme.
250. Bets received on an athlete or a team that for whatever reason was disqualified or quit the competition, cannot be winning bets, except if otherwise stated in the Program.
251. If for whatever reason a team did not participate in the competition, players' bets on this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00).
252. In case the competition is suspended for whatever reason, any prediction for this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00), unless at the moment of suspension there is a winning outcome (an outcome or result that could not be changed even if the competition was continued and completed as stated by the governing body or Association holding the event).

Goal/No Goal in a Football Match

The player is asked to predict if both teams will score a ("Goal") in a football match or if any one of the two teams or both teams will not score ("No Goal") in a football match.

253. The team or the teams that scored are the ones stated by the governing body or Association holding the event and will be published by the Company, based on the result produced at the end of regular time of the match.
254. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after both teams have scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the bets on "Goal" will be considered winning, while bets on "No Goal" will be considered losing.
255. If a match is suspended before the start of the second half after only one team has scored or both teams have not scored, and the time left from the suspension until the regular end of the match is not played (based on the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the prediction of any outcome for this type of bet will be given odds of one (1.00).
256. If a match is suspended after the beginning of the second half of the match, and the rest of the match is not played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the winning outcome for this bet, will be based on the result at the time of suspension.
257. If a match is suspended, and re-started (in the event's local time) and concluded within the next day from the date stated in the Program, then the winning outcome for this bet, will be based on the result, at the final conclusion of the match the next day.
258. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players' bets for "Goal / No Goal" will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).

Final Result of a Cricket Match

The player is asked to predict the final result of a cricket match. The type of match and its duration (test, county championship, one-day match) are published in the Program.

259. The possible outcome for a draw between the two teams can be offered for all types of matches, except in one-day matches.
260. The final result of a match is the result achieved at the conclusion of play, according to the announcement of the relevant organising body of the competition/match.
261. In case of a tie (draw) result in all matches for which “Draw” is not offered as a possible outcome, all bets received on the final result will be given odds of one (1.00).
262. In case the organising body of the competition/match at the conclusion of the match announces “No result”, all bets received on the final result will be given odds of one (1.00).
263. If a match is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the match is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond 2 (two) calendar days from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes in venue or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players’ bets for the final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
264. If the match (test or 3-5 days international) was suspended after the match has been started and at least one ball has been bowled, all bets for the final result will stand.
265. If a one-day match (20 overs) was suspended after at least five (5) overs have been bowled by each of the two teams, then all bets will stand and the winning

outcome is determined according to the Duckworth Lewis method. In all other circumstances, players' bets for the final result will be given odds of one (1.00).

266. If a one-day match (40 or 50 overs) was suspended after at least twenty (20) overs have been played by each of the two teams, then all bets will stand and the winning outcome is determined according to the Duckworth Lewis method. In all other circumstances, players' bets for the final result will be given odds of one (1.00).

Winner of a Cricket Series

The player is asked to predict the outcome of a cricket series (team A to win, team B to win, neither team to win).

267. The number of wins per team is the number of wins officially announced by the organising body of the series at the end of the series.
268. Bets received on a team, who for whatever reason, was disqualified or withdrew from the series, are not winning bets unless otherwise stated in the Program. The winning outcome is one determined by the organising body of the series.
269. Bets received for any team who for whatever reason did not participate in the series will be given odds of one (1.00).
270. If the Series were suspended before the scheduled number of matches is completed, then the team that is ahead at the time will be the winner. If no team is ahead, the winning outcome is the "Draw".
271. If the Series are cancelled all bets will be given odds of one (1.00).

Top Bowler or Top Batsman of a Cricket competition - Team Top Bowler or Team Top Batsman

The player is asked to predict which bowler will take the most wickets or which batsman will score the most runs in a certain cricket competition or in any part of it. The player may also predict which cricket player among the players of one team will take the most wickets or will score the most runs in a certain cricket competition or in any part of it.

272. Determining the top bowler or top batsman or the team top bowler or team top batsman in a certain competition or in a part of it is done in accordance with the rules set down by the competition's organizing body and the results as they developed within the framework of the competition, unless otherwise stated in the Program.
273. Bets received on cricket players who did not participate in the competition will not be considered as winning.
274. Bets received on cricket players whose team was disqualified from the competition, will be given odds of one (1.00).
275. If the competition is cancelled, any prediction for the top bowler or top batsman of a cricket competition or team top bowler or team top batsman will be given odds of one (1.00).
276. If there are two or more players that have taken the same number of wickets or have scored the same number of runs and are considered top bowlers or top batsmen of a cricket completion or the team top bowlers or team top batsmen in a certain competition or in a part of it, the odds for each of them are divided by the total number of top bowlers or top batsmen.

Final Result of a Match in American Football

The player is asked to make a prediction on the final outcome of a certain match in American football (matches that are organised by the National League and the College Association).

277. A match of American football can be offered by the Company with an advantage (handicap) of points in favour of one of the two teams, which is announced in the Program or through terminal messages via the online computer system. The starting advantages are published in the Program. Winning advantages are ones that are valid at the moment of validation by the Central Computer System.
278. The results officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company and considered the final results. These are based on the final outcome produced during the regular duration of the game, overtime included. If after overtime the game result is a “Draw”, then all bets will be given odds of one (1.00)
279. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the game is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond within the next day from the date stated in the Program or if a game was suspended before 55 minutes of play are completed, or if there are changes in venue or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' bets for final result will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
280. If a game was suspended after 55 minutes of play are completed and at the moment of suspension the score was a “Draw”, then players' bets for the final result will be given odds of one (1.00).

**Total Number of Points Scored in a Game in American Football/
“Under – Over” a Specified Limit or Within a Certain Range**

The player is asked to predict if the total number of points scored in a game in American Football is “under” or “over” a limit or is within a range published in the Program.

281. The total number of points scored in a game in American Football is the total number officially announced by the governing body or Association holding the event, will be published by the Company based on the outcome produced at the end of regular duration of the game, overtime included.
282. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the game is finally played (in the event's local time) within the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes in venue or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances, players’ bets for “Under-Over” or for Total Number of points will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
283. If a game was suspended before 55 minutes are completed and if at the moment of suspension the total number of points already scored is greater than the limit or is within the higher range published in the Program, then the outcome “over” or the predictions being in the higher range for the Total number of points are considered the winning outcome while the outcome “under” or the predictions being not in the higher range is the losing outcome.
284. If a game was suspended before 55 minutes of play are completed and if at the moment of suspension the total number of points already scored is less than the limit or the total number of points scored is within a range below the higher range published in the Program, then both outcomes - “over” and “under” – and all predictions on the total number of points are given odds of one (1.00).
285. If a game was suspended after 55 minutes of play are completed, then the total number of points scored at the time of suspension and stated be the governing

body or Association holding the event, will be considered as the final total number of points scored.

First, Last or Anytime Scorer of a Touchdown of an American Football Game

The player is asked to predict which football player will be the first, the last or anytime scorer of a touchdown during a football game.

286. The first, the last or anytime touchdown scored is the ones scored during the regular duration of the game, overtime included.
287. If a football player was not included in the team's roster (i.e. he is not "suited up") it is considered that he did not take part in the game. In this case bets received on a football player for scorer of the first or of the last or of anytime touchdown, will be given odds of one (1.00).
288. If a game is cancelled or postponed and the actual date the game is finally played (in the event's local time) is beyond within the next day from the date stated in the Program or if there are changes in venue or replacements regarding which team is the home and which is the away team, or there is a change of opponents after the Program is published, then in all these circumstances players' bets for the first, the last or anytime touchdown scorer will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00).
289. If a game was suspended before 55 minutes of play are completed and before a touchdown is scored, players' bets for the first, the last or anytime touchdown scorer will be accepted but the odds will be one (1.00). If a game was suspended before 55 minutes of play are completed and after at least one touchdown is scored, players' bets that include first touchdown scorer will be considered valid. Players' bets for the anytime touchdown scorer that include the predictions of touchdown scorer or scorer already scored will be winning, while the predictions for other football players who did not score will be given odds of one (1.00).

Players' bets for the last touchdown scorer will be accepted, but the odds will be one (1.00).

290. If a game was suspended after 55 minutes of play are completed, the winning outcome for players' bets for the first or the last or anytime touchdown scorer will be based on the result, valid at the time of suspension.
291. Prediction for any touchdown scorer of an American football game can be combined in one betting line with a prediction for first and/or last touchdown scorer of the same game. It is also allowed to combine in one betting line prediction for first touchdown scorer with a prediction for last touchdown scorer. One betting line cannot combine predictions regarding the same football player.
